This examination schedule is tentative and is subject to change without notice. A final schedule of examinations will be posted prior to the end of the semester. Students must be available to take examinations on any day during the examination period. Students: Pleasae arrive to the exam room a minimum of 15 minutes prior to the exam start time. Any time lost due to late arrivals will be exam time that is forfeited.

Individual examinations will be re-scheduled only because of emergency circumstances (such as a documented illness) or conflicts as indicated below: Exam Conflict Definitions:

- Two examinations are scheduled for the same time and date.
- There are four or fewer ours between the scheduled end of one exam and the scheduled start of the next exam.
- Three examinations are scheduled on two consecutive calendar days.

In order to petition to reschedule an exam due to an emergency or conflict (as specified above), the student <u>must</u> complete the *Petition to Reschedule Exam form* and submit it to the Law Registrar's Office by October 1, 2013 to be considered.
