HIS FALL CLASS "SHAKESPEARE AT THE OPERA" CANCELLED

Professor James Keolker has suffered a severe injury to his ankle that forces him to cancel his Fall 2009 course, "Shakespeare at the Opera." He'll be in rehab for the next eight weeks and will be unable to teach his class. As disappointed as we are that he'll not be joining us this session, we know that all of you join with us in wishing him a speedy recovery.

As a student who was enrolled, we want to make you aware of your options.

On Tuesday afternoon we have moved Professor Pierson's course "The U.S. & The Second World War" into the Xavier Auditorium and Professor Newbrun's course "The Story of Alphabets and Scripts" into the Berman Room — opening both up with extra seats should you wish to select them. You may enroll in these two (or any other open course) as a replacement for Professor Keolker's cancelled course.

As an additional offering, if you would be interested, Professor Keolker has selected some filmed versions for screening/viewing from the many operas that were included in his syllabus. To share them with you in advance of his future return, we have created a new course called "**Shakespeare at the Opera On Film**" that will screen Professor Keolker's selections on Tuesdays from 1 p.m. to 2:40 p.m. in the Maier Room.
