SCREENING QUESTIONS

It is very important that we interview the appropriate adult in each household so that we can understand how charitable activity can contribute to the solution of these problems in California. In addition, we are making donations to several local charities in the name of each person who completes the interview. So please, may I speak to the adult who has had the most recent birthday?"

Refused again - Thank them and disconnect. (Note time and day of call so that a callback can be set up for a later date as if it were a fresh call. Second call should be on a different day and at a different time to increase likelihood of getting a different person. It should also be about two weeks later.)

Volunteering
