Dear friends,

In 2011, an underlying theme at the law school was recognition of how our faculty has transformed in the last 15 years. We have built on a tradition of excellent writing even as we have greatly enhanced our productivity. Nowhere is this more evident than in our scholarly achievements.

Consider some recent honors our faculty members have garnered. Professor Peter Jan Honigsberg received grants from the Roddick Foundation and the Sigrid Rausing Trust for his Witness to Guantanamo project and Professor Emeritus Jay Folberg received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American College of Civil Trial Mediators. Associate Professor Richard Leo was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship for his forthcoming book, *The Innocence Revolution*, the next installment in a series of award-winning monographs he has written on false confessions and wrongful convictions. E.L. Wiegand Distinguished Professor in Tax Daniel Lathrope was designated a life member of the American Law Institute, and Professor Bill Ong Hing was bestowed the Keith Aoki Asian Pacific American Jurisprudence Award and a lifetime achievement award from the Centro Legal de la Raza.

Similarly, longstanding faculty members and new appointees alike have written influential work in cutting edge areas of the law including the free speech rights of corporations, constitutional protection of cell phone data, the role of mindfulness and meditation in legal practice, the implications of antitrust doctrine for the “too-big-to-fail” phenomenon, and the questionable nature of developments in class certification doctrine.

We cannot know what legal developments 2012 will bring. We can, however, predict with great confidence that USF School of Law faculty members will be writing about them with energy and insight.

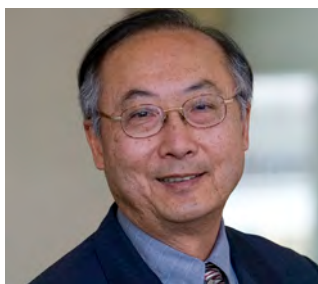
