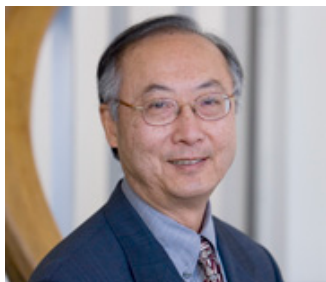
Presentations and Lectures

Professor Rhonda Magee presented “Spiritualizing Legal Education” at a meeting of the Project for the Integration of Spirituality, Law, and Politics.

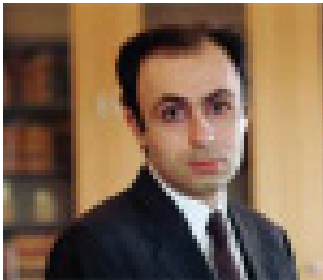
Professor Jesse Markham Jr. presented during the seminar “International Competition Law Regime” at the George Washington University Law School.
