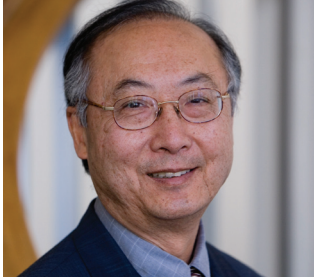




## FACULTY SCHOLARSHIP, SERVICE, & MEDIA

### Awards



**Professor Bill Ong Hing** was awarded the Keith Aoki Asian Pacific American Jurisprudence Award at Hofstra University. The award is bestowed upon an individual who has written on or advocated for Asian Pacific American rights, or explored Asian Pacific American identity, history, or rights through law or other disciplines.

**Center for Law and Global Justice Assistant Director for Haiti Programs Nicole Phillips** co-authored "A Rights-Based Approach to Lawyering: Legal Empowerment as an Alternative to Legal Aid in Post-Disaster Haiti," published in the *Northwestern University Journal of International Human Rights*.

### Briefs and Court Citations



**Professor Connie de la Vega** co-authored an amicus brief for *People v. Caballero*, which was submitted to the California Supreme Court on behalf of Human Rights Advocates, Human Rights Watch, the Juvenile Law Center, the Center for Juvenile Law and Policy, the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, and the Disability Rights Legal Center. The brief argues that the 110-year to life sentence given to a juvenile offender for a non-homicide crime violates the Constitution, international law, and U.S. treaty obligations.

**Professor Susan Freiwald** authored an amicus brief cited by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas. The court concurred with Freiwald's brief and declared that a law authorizing the government to obtain cellular records without a search warrant is unconstitutional.
