

# Finding Articles in Magazines and Journals

## Magazines available on the web:

Directories, like Yahoo, have categories of information that can help you find magazines and newspapers.

## **Magazines at the Library:**

*The USF Library has subscriptions to over 2,400 periodicals in print, and thousands of full text magazines and journals in our databases. They are arranged by subject on the “Start Your Research” webpage.*

### **Journal Finder**

Journal Finder is a tool that lets you determine if the library subscribes to a magazine, either in print or in one of our databases.

*If it is physically in the library:*

All of our print magazines and journals are on the second floor of the library, in the Periodicals Section, in alphabetical order by title.

*In Library Databases:*

### **Proquest & InfoTrac**

Both of these are companies that produce databases that “index” articles in magazines and journals. They cover a broad range of subjects, and index popular magazines, academic journals, newspapers, and trade publications. They are often good databases to start off with because of their wide ranging coverage.

*There are many other databases that the library subscribes to and many of them have full text magazine and journal articles.*

**The San Francisco Public Library** subscribes to many of these databases, and similar ones.
