Traveling West From the Bay Bridge/East Bay

After crossing the Bay Bridge, follow the signs for the Fell Street/Mission Street exit. Take the Fell Street exit. Stay on Fell Street for approximately two miles. Make a right on Shrader Street and a right on Golden Gate Avenue. Proceed to the visitor's entrance on Golden Gate between Kittredge Terrace and Roselyn Terrace.

Traveling North from the Peninsula

Take Highway 280 Northbound. Take the 19th Avenue exit. Stay on 19th Avenue for approximately three miles. Make a right on Fulton Street. At the top of the hill, turn left on Parker Avenue and then right on Golden Gate Avenue. Proceed to the visitor's entrance on Golden Gate between Kittredge Terrace and Roselyn Terrace.
