

Using *USF: Find Full-Text*

What is *USF: Find Full-Text*?

USF: Find Full-Text links to the full-text of journal articles and related resources from citations in library databases. It is designed to be an efficient way to help you find the full-text of an article, whether that is through another database, the library's print holdings, or other services such as InterLibrary Loan. It is available in about half our databases and is expected to expand.

When can I use *USF: Find Full-Text*?

You can use *USF: Find Full-Text* wherever you see these icons or links:



Use *USF: Find Full-Text* when there is no direct link to the full text.

How do I use *USF: Find Full-Text*?

Beside every citation in a database that implements *USF: Find Full-Text* you will see one of the *USF: Find Full-Text* icons. Click on the icon to be linked to full-text options. It may take a few moments to load. For example:

What do the results mean?

Start at the top and work your way down when analyzing the *USF: Find Full Text* results. If the full-text of the article is available through a different database, the results will look like this:

Items may be available in print or online in Gleeson Library | Geschke Center or the Zief Law Library.

For journal articles: Click on *Ignacio* to see if we have the physical copy in the library. Click on *Journal Finder* to see if we have the print or online journal your article is in. This is a way of double-checking the Find Full-Text results.

For books or book chapters: Click on *Ignacio* to see if we have the book. When searching for the book in *Ignacio*, be sure to look above and below the red letters to see if a title matches what you are looking for:

If the book is not available, you can also click [SEARCH LINK +](#) on the right of the *Ignacio* screen to see if a copy is available at a Link+ affiliate library. Link+ takes around 4 business days, is only for books, not journals, and is free!
