Who May Apply

Applicants who hold a Bachelor's degree in any field and have fulfilled the foundation requirements (see next page) are considered for admission as a graduate student with regular status. Those without the foundation requirements are considered for admission as a graduate student with conditional status.

Application Deadline

March 1 for fall admission (late August) and **October 15** for spring admission (late January). Applications are accepted after these dates. Visit www.usfca.edu/msws and click on "How to Apply."

For priority consideration for admission and scholarships, applicants are encouraged to submit all application items to USF several weeks before the application dates of March 1 and October 15.

Application Items

FIRST STEP: Application Form and Fee

Submit the form and application fee (\$55; payable to the University of San Francisco) online at www.usfca.edu/grad/applyonline or by mail. Submit this form **first** in the application process.

Send all application items to the Office of Graduate Programs. Do not send application items to the Department of Computer Science.

Please ensure that the full name on your application form and each application item are identical. If your names differ in any way, include a note with your application items so that USF can match your items to your application file. Also, include the name of your graduate program on each application item and your birthdate.

If you would like to be considered for the Emphasis in Entrepreneurship, include "Entrepreneurship" in the emphasis field.

Computer Science Background Essay

A 1- to 3-page double-spaced document that describes your involvement in software development, research, and extracurricular experiences. Topics in which the Program is interested include:

1. Your significant software development projects, including whether the project was commercial, academic, or just for fun.
2. Research projects in which you have been involved.
3. Any published articles or other technical documents that you have authored or co-authored.
4. Significant skills and interests you have beyond computer science, especially those that show creativity.
5. Experience in communicating technical material, such as teaching or making presentations.

Also, describe your individual role in any of the following endeavors, and what technology and languages you used:

6. Management or team leadership roles.
7. Experience in public service projects.

Transcripts

Submit one official transcript (academic record) from each university, college (university-level), or community college that you have attended. International students also need to submit a copy of the transcript and diploma (document that indicates that a Bachelor's Degree has been completed) in the original language and in English translation.

Résumé

Submit an updated résumé that describes your employment history and other experience that may be relevant and beneficial to the graduate program to which you apply.

Letters of Recommendation

Submit two letters of recommendation (academic or professional preferred; e.g., professor or work supervisor) with the forms provided.

GRE Scores

You can scan and upload your own copy of your GRE general test score report as you apply online. As you upload your score copy,

ensure that you have also requested that an official score report be sent to USF. The USF school code for GRE is **6996** or **4850**. The GRE may be waived for candidates with exceptional professional or academic experience.

International Students

(Not a Citizen or Permanent Resident of the U.S.)

Visit www.usfca.edu/asinternational for important information for international applicants, including test score policies. Nonimmigrant students must include a **non-U.S. mailing address**. In addition to the application items above, international students need to submit the following:

English Language Exams

Submit official TOEFL, IELTS or PTE (Pearson Test of English) examination scores. A minimum TOEFL score of 530 (Paper Test) or 71 (iBT), or IELTS score of 6.0, is required for consideration. For test score policies, visit www.usfca.edu/asinternational. After review of an application, coursework in USF's Intensive English Program may be recommended or required.

Students applying to the MS Program with an emphasis in Entrepreneurship require a minimum TOEFL score of 600 (PT) or 100 (iBT), or IELTS score of 7.0.

Certification of Finances

(Please Read Carefully)

International applicants who require an F-1 visa must verify that they (or sponsors) can fund their educational and living expenses during studies in the United States (funds required for each program are indicated on the Certification form). This requires that the **Certification of Finance** form is completed and submitted along with bank statements when an application is submitted. If you cannot complete the Certification, then please do not apply to this graduate program.

Please Note: If you do not submit Certification of Finance documents then your application will not be considered for admission.

Passport Photo Page

You can scan and upload a copy of your passport photo and personal information page as you apply online, or mail a copy with your other application items.

Financial Assistance

A number of Graduate Fellowships that partially cover tuition are offered to applicants with outstanding academic backgrounds. All admitted students are considered for these fellowships. A limited number of hourly-wage teaching assistantships in the Department of Computer Science are also available. Student employment on campus is available at the Office of Student Employment.

U.S. citizens and permanent residents are eligible to apply for low-interest loans offered by the U.S. federal student loan program. For information visit www.fafsa.ed.gov or contact USF's One Stop Office at (415) 422-2020 or onestop@usfca.edu. The USF school code for FAFSA is **001325**. Submit your FAFSA as early as possible, even before your admission decision is made.

In your email subject heading, please include the type of document you are sending, such as "Resumé" or "Statement of Purpose" and include your full application name and graduate program in your email.

Scans of bank statements, Certification of Finance, transcripts or English language test scores are not accepted by email. These original documents must be mailed.
