





HOW TO APPLY

Submit your application (Common Application, Coalition Application, or the free USF application), along with the following materials:

- □ Academic record/transcript
- ☐ Proof of English Language Proficiency (ELP) Required of non-native English speakers
- ☐ Certification of finances (F-1 or J-1 visa applicants only)
- ☐ Optional: SAT/ACT test scores Test scores can be used to prove ELP
- ☐ Optional: letter of recommendation from a teacher or counselor

TRANSFER TO USF

You need:

- 24 semester/36 quarter units (30 semester/45 quarter for nursing)
- 2.5 GPA or higher (3.0 or higher for engineering, 3.3 or higher for nursing)


CERTIFICATION OF FINANCES

F-1 or J-1 applicants are required to complete a Certification of Finances that shows your ability to pay for your first year at USF.

SCHOLARSHIPS

International students are eligible for partial tuition merit scholarships (from \$25,000 to \$38,000/year for first-year students, and from \$14,000 to \$20,000/year for transfers) based on academic strength. Need-based financial aid is only available to U.S. citizens or eligible noncitizens.
