TRANSFER SOONER.

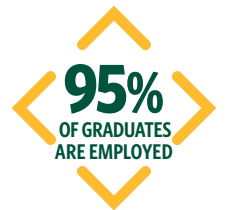

GET REAL WORLD ROI.

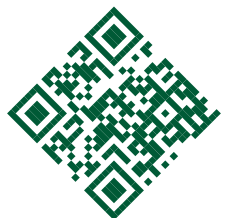

LEARN IN THE COMMUNITY.

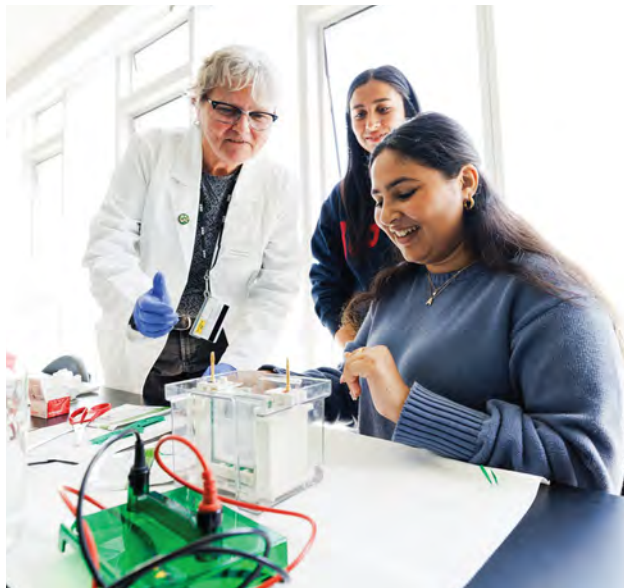

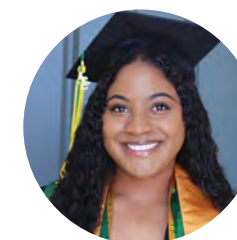
SEE WHERE OUR GRADS END UP:

➤ **NOLAN WARD '24 (ENGINEERING)** was part of the first cohort of engineering students at USF. In his junior year, he got an internship at Northrop Grumman, where he now works full-time as an electrical engineer.



➤ **DERIANA BROWN '25 (ACCOUNTING, ENTREPRENEURSHIP & INNOVATION)** secured an audit associate position at Deloitte after connecting with a recruiter on campus. HOW TO APPLY

1. Complete at least 24 transferable semester units with a 2.5+ GPA (3.0 for engineering; 3.0 units and a 3.3 for nursing)
2. Apply using our streamlined transfer application: usfca.edu/transfer.
3. Send your transcripts. (unofficial transcripts OK)
4. U.S. citizens and permanent residents should submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using USF school code 001325. Eligible undocumented students in California should submit the California Dream Act application. Eligible undocumented students outside California should submit the CSS profile.
