

University of San Francisco, School of Law Admissions Information

As with all accredited law schools, the University of San Francisco requires a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university. USF observes the standards of the American Bar Association that requires no more than 10 percent of the credit presented for admission be non-theory courses without intellectual content of substantial value.

That said, USF does recommend an undergraduate curriculum that is a wide-ranging, liberal education and considers it to be more advisable and useful than a narrow emphasis on vocationally oriented courses. The faculty particularly recommends courses that provide training in written and oral expression, and which are intellectually and analytically demanding.
